

















Alcohol. A depressant; most widely abused drug; used by 52% of NJ students before they finish 8th grade.

Lingo: Jello shots, funnels, keg stands, shot gunning, kings, beer pong, quarters.

Short Term Effects: Reduced Inhibition, dizziness, slurred speech, aggression.

Long Term Effects: Alcoholism, withdrawal symptoms, brain & liver damage, one-third of fatal crashes are alcohol related.

Street Smarts: Alcopops, sports bottles, "hosting," drinking games, \$6-\$10.

Marijuana. Mix of shredded, dried leaves and flowers.

Lingo: Joint, bong, bowl, roach, weed, dutch, spliff, blunt, pipe, brownies.

Short Term Effects: Memory & motor coordination loss, distorted perception, anxiety, euphoria, hilarity, eye irritation, hunger, cotton mouth.

Long Term Effects: Moderate psychological dependence, lung damage, cancer.

Street Smarts: Increased potency, gateway drug, cigar wrappers, "420", nickels & dimes, \$10 (bag).

Heroin. Highly addictive drug derived from morphine.

Lingo: Big H, black tar, brown sugar, horse, junk, smack, dope, mainlining, chasing the dragon.

Short Term Effects: Euphoric rush, nausea, drowsiness, clouded thinking, distorted perception, slurred speech, constricted pupils, droopy eyelids, neck scratching.

Long Term Effects: High risk of physical & psychological dependence, tolerance & withdrawal, collapsed veins, muscle pain, insomnia, sudden withdrawal can be fatal.

Street Smarts: Smoke/injection, 74%-84% purity, \$10 (bag).

Prescription/otc drugs. Prescribed or over-the-counter medications abused to get a high.

Lingo: (Tranquilizers) Mebaral, Quaaludes, Xanax, Valium, Nembutal. (Stimulants) Adderall, Dexedrine, Ritalin. (Pain Killers) Codeine, OxyContin, Percocet, Vicodin.

Short Term Effects: Euphoric rush, depressants and alcohol can be fatal, heart attack, lethal seizures, irritability, paranoia, suicidal ideation.

Long Term Effects: High risk of physical dependence, tolerance & withdrawal, restlessness, insomnia, muscle pain.

Street Smarts: Bowling, "Robotrippin," study drugs, Oxycontin: \$1 per mg. (40 mg most popular).

Methamphetamine. Unpredictable stimulant affecting the central nervous system.

Lingo: Ice, crystal, meth, crank, speed, uppers. Can be swallowed, injected, smoked, or snorted. Made from pseudoephedrine.

Short Term Effects: Euphoric rush, alertness, suppressed appetite, erratic behavior, tremors, mood swings, unpredictability, insomnia, irregular heart rate.

Long Term Effects: Psychological dependence, coma, stroke.

Street Smarts: Club drug, suppressed appetite, meth mouth, meth babies, \$20 (bag).

Inhalants. Household products that can be inhaled or sniffed to get high.

Lingo: Poppers, whippets, hair spray, gasoline, model glue, nail polish remover, spray paint, whipped cream, cleaning fluid, cooking spray, correction fluid, Dust Off. Can be sniffed, snorted, bagged or huffed.

Short Term Effects: Intoxication, loss of consciousness, death, headache, weak muscles, abdominal pain, mood swings, violent behavior.

Long Term Effects: Can induce heart failure, suffocation, organ damage, hearing loss, limb spasms.

Street Smarts: Balloons, \$3 (whipped cream), \$6 (dusting).

Cocaine. Highly addictive drug made from the leaves of the coca plant.

Lingo: Big C, blow, coke, freebase, lady, rock, nose candy, snow, white crack, yay. Can be snorted or injected. Crack can be smoked.

Short Term Effects: Dilated pupils, insomnia, loss of appetite, increased heart rate, blood pressure & temperature, "crash" (depression, irritability, fatigue).

Long Term Effects: High risk of psychological dependence, paranoia, aggression, depression from withdrawal.

Street Smarts: Razors & Mirrors, \$5-\$10 (crack).

Steroids. Testosterone-related substance abused to enhance physical appearance.

Lingo: Juice, Roids. Can be taken orally or injected.

Short Term Effects: Increases in lean muscle mass and strength, liver tumors, jaundice, fluid retention, infertility, baldness, paranoid jealousy, extreme irritability, delusions, impaired judgment, feelings of invincibility.

Long Term Effects: Long-term, high-dose effects are unknown.

Street Smarts: Cycling, Stacking, Roid-Rage.

Ecstasy. Synthetic drug with hallucinogenic properties.

Lingo: E, Adam, X, XTC, MDMA, Eve. Tablets often branded (Nike, CK, Apple, clover, star, butterfly, Mercedes, smiley, X's, etc.).

Short Term Effects: Distorted perception, lockjaw, chills, sweating, increased body temperature, severe dehydration, hyperthermia, insomnia, anxiety, depression.

Long Term Effects: Memory, mood, appetite & pain regulation, kidney, liver, or cardiovascular failure.

Street Smarts: Glowsticks, pacifiers, raves, mint containers, sextasy, alcohol free parties, \$20-\$25.

Warning signs

Signs that your child may be experimenting with drugs or alcohol. Behavioral • Secretive, deceptive, or

- Risky behavior
- Slipping grades, lateness, skipping class
- Fights with family/friends
- Change in friends
- Change in mood, eating or sleeping patterns
- Depressed/less motivation
- Missing money/valuables
- Trouble with the law
- Increased candle, incense, or air freshener use

Secretive, deceptive, or manipulative behavior

Physical

- Neglecting appearance or hygiene
- Sudden change in weight
- Slurred speech
- Skin abrasions
- Chemical smell on breath or clothing
- Glassy or red eyes
- Drug paraphernalia
